What Are Benefits of Divorce Mediation?

- Control over important decisions affecting you (and your children).
- Discovery of unique and appropriate ways to resolve areas of disagreement and interpersonal conflict.
- Greater likelihood that the terms of the agreement reached will be honored in the future.
- Less trauma for the children involved.
- Reduction of hostility between participants.
- Growth in the ability of each participant to assert him or herself and to understand, articulate, and provide for his or her own needs.
